OUTSTANDING ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Tony Reed 1996 Inductee

California Community College Football Coaches Association Hall of Fame, Post-1965 Player

ANTELOPE VALLEY — In 1973, Tony Reed was the Central Conference's Most Valuable Player, as well as an All-State running back. In 1974, he helped lead the Marauders to a state championship, while being named the Central Conference's MVP, as well as the State Player of the Year. He was also tabbed as First Team JC Gridwire All-America. He still holds 16 records at Antelope Valley College. Original enshrinee in the Whit Carter Hall of Fame.

POST ANTELOPE VALLEY COMPETITION — Transferred to Colorado and was named All-Big-8 in 1976, as well as making several All-America teams. Third running back drafted behind Ricky Bell and Tony Dorsett in 1977 draft by the Kansas City Chiefs, Reed was the Chiefs MVP in 1979, after rushing for more than 1000 yards and pulling in 50 receptions. Finished his career with the Denver Broncos.

Jim Johnson 2004 Inductee

CCCFCA Hall of Fame, Post-1965 Player

ANTELOPE VALLEY — Considered by many, including coach Brent Carder, to be the most versatile player in Antelope Valley College Marauder Football history Johnson played for both of AVC's state championship teams--in 1974 and 1975. He gained 1828 yards for the Marauders in those years, including 1109 in 1975. He is ranked fifth in career rushing yardage, sixth in season rushing and has the fifth best rushing game in Marauder history with 274 yards against Merced in 1975. In 1975, he was the team and Central Conference Most Valuable Player, as well as the State co-Player of the Year. In addition to his rushing chores, Johnson was the Marauders' punter, averaging 41.6 yards a punt in 1975, as well as linebacker and place kicker.

POST ANTELOPE VALLEY COMPETITION — Johnson played football on full scholarship at the University of Oregon, where he led the Ducks in rushing in 1976.
